Explanation Of Financial Statement

I would like to take this part of the newsletter and explain the financial statement of our district. Under the income section, the \$2,932.06 is what was sent to me by Mr. Steve Moore as was the \$1,035.09 and \$821.60 is what I brought back from the SEATA meeting in July, (it consisted of registration fees, exhibitors fees and some dues money from the national office). The dues \$4,122.00 is what we have received from the national office as the district's part of your yearly dues and the dues from the new members that come through the district secretary/treasurer's office. The interest earned is off our silver savings account.

The breakdown on the expenditures are as follows:

1. Payment for typing and postage for mailing. (Newsletter and everyday)
2. Cost of forms, envelopes, and office materials
3. Telephone expense that is charged to a credit card where the bill comes with my personal home phone bill.
4. Audio Visual Aids, projectors for the District Meeting
5. Larry Gardner's travel to speak at Atlanta.
6. Recognition to the speakers at our district meeting.
7. Hospitality room for our exhibitors at Atlanta.
8. Cost of printing the 600 copies of our September newsletter.
9. This one is dues paid. What we do is have new members send me a check for their total dues. I in turn send their application to the national office for that portion of their dues which belong to the national office.

Please note that our money is all in one bank, First Columbus, National of Columbus, MS and consist of a checking account and a silver savings account. In the very near future I am going to turn the checking account into an interest paying account.

I welcome any questions about this report and will do my best to keep these records accurate and up to date. I even keep a ledger sheet by the month to help keep the cheking account straight.

After the mid winter board meeting I would like to bring to your attention the following items:

Item 1. All certified trainers will be required to complete a form checking their "actively engaged" status. (must be completed annually)

Item 2. Hours spent teaching, lecturing, in practicums and/or labs related to training can now count towards certification hours for students. (District 9 opposed)

Item 3. The secretary for professional education will be moved to Greenville on July 1, 1981. President Chambers is searching for a new chair for this committee.

Item 4. Each district is financially independent of the NATA. Our district secretary will coordinate all transfers of money related to membership dues with Ms. Ederley.

Item 5. Mr. May is now directed to apply for "tax exempt status" from the internal revenue service.

Item 6. Chris Patrick (Florida) has been invited to serve as the NATA liason representative to the American College Health Association.

Item 7. A membership classification for high school students was discussed. A motion for this classification was defeated.

Item 8. The District Executive Committee, in consultation with financial and legal advisors, has voted not to hire an auditor to audit our district records. Mr. McIntyre has made several suggestions for future record keeping.

THE SUPERVISED ATHLETIC TRAINING WORK EXPERIENCE FOR SATISFYING THE EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENT FOR ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP OR CERTIFICATION

The worker must be a full time student in a college or have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university. The work experience must be in an athletic training setting - not primarily in a clinical setting away from preparation for practice, contests and on the field first aid duties - and should include contact with a variety of sports.

The work must be done under the direct supervision of a N.A.T.A. Certified Athletic Trainer and must be done in connection with programs of institutions or organizations of which the supervising trainer is an employee. All of the work experience does not have to be done under the same supervisor or at the same organization or institution.

The person to whom the work hours are to be credited shall be responsible for keeping a log of supervised work hours with signatures of the supervising athletic trainer. However, if a N.A.T.A. Certified Athletic Trainer has working under him/her a person(s) who may conceivably wish to have supervised work hours recorded for future needs of membership or certification such persons should be informed of the necessity of keeping verifiable records.
